Words from our Pastor:

My Dear Family in Christ,

More than four months has passed since I began my new life as a parish priest at these two faith-filled parishes -- Saint Joseph and Saint Francis -- I serve by the call of the Holy Spirit. It is a great honor to serve each person who is connected to these beautiful parishes.
